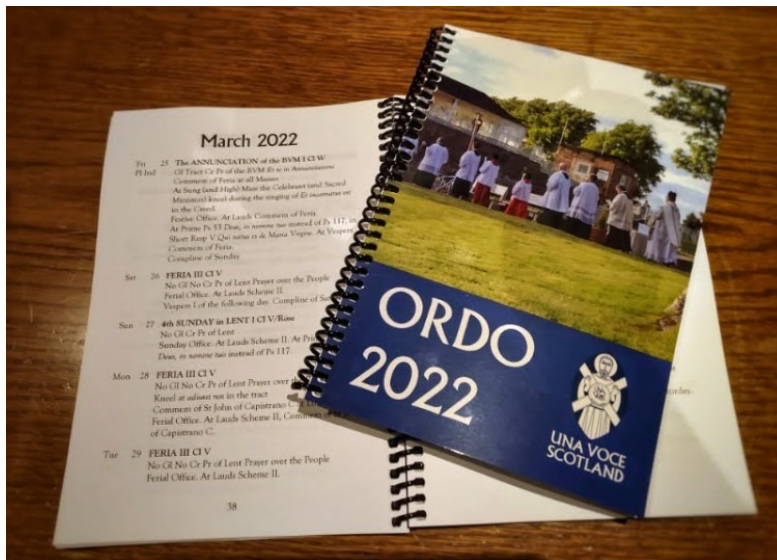

We are working on the UVS Ordo for next year. This is an essential tool for all priests, servers, liturgical musicians and anyone who wishes to live the liturgical calendar at home. This is the only ordo which is bespoke to the TLM in Scotland, detailing the feasts of Scottish saints and celebrations which are particular to the dioceses of Scotland. We will advertise

these when they are available for sale. It was wonderful to meet Fr Neil Campbell from Canada who orders several Ordos each year. He unexpectedly attended our last Mass at Carfin!

## National Pilgrimage Masses at Lourdes Grotto, Carfin

Since our last newsletter we have had our two annual pilgrimage Masses at the National Marian Shrine at Carfin Grotto. The first was the Nativity of St John the Baptist and despite the rail strikes, we managed a reasonable crowd at the altar near the statue of St John Paul II. It was wonderful to see young families and all generations at this Mass and providence kept the rain at bay. The second Mass was that of Our Lady on Saturday and was held in the parish church. Although we were moved inside due to the preparations for the visit of the relics of St Bernadette, it was felt that the setting was more conducive, especially since the wind has previously posed a threat to the Blessed Sacrament!



We are fortunate, in these times, to have two public Masses in a National Shrine, with the permission of the Bishop. Despite the emails and comments in criticism of these Masses, I ask members and friends to continue to support these events. Our mission is to make the Old Rite available and to enable more people to encounter Christ through the beauty of the sacred liturgy and these Masses fulfil this aim. Our heartfelt thanks go to all those who go to great lengths to attend, those with children, transport limitations or ill health. We also owe our clergy, musicians and servers a debt of gratitude for dedicating their time and talents to making these occasions worthy of the sacred liturgy and the worship of God. Dates for our Summer and Autumn Masses at Carfin for 2023 are being finalised at the moment and we will share these as soon as we can

## Resourcing the Traditional Roman Rite in Scotland

In this time of limited freedom for the Traditional Mass, one of the parts of our work which continues is the provision of sacred articles for its celebration. In the last few months, with the financial support of members, we have provided Missals (some brand new!) altar cards and rituals to priests who are interested in offering the Mass at least privately. One such priest is Fr Malcolm Hutchison of Dunkeld Diocese. Fr O'Connor presented him with a brand new altar Missal on or behalf after the new priest offered his first blessings to the people at St Mary's Cleland.

“A Message from Bishop Philip to the Faithful of St. Mary’s Gosport and St. Columba’s Bridgemaary for the Twenty-Fourth Sunday of the Year, 11th September 2022.

My dear Parishioners,

At the end of this month, the Friars of the Family of Mary Immaculate and St. Francis will be moving from Gosport to a new community house in Dundee, Scotland. Although they will continue to maintain a small presence in Portsmouth North End, the new house in Scotland will be much larger and enable them to develop their community-life together as a friary. I must also announce that around the same time, the Sisters of the Franciscan Family of the Immaculate Heart and St. Maximilian Kolbe will be leaving Bridgemaary and Alderney in order to live together in a large former convent near the Friars in Dundee.

On all our behalf I wish to express our immense gratitude to both the Friars and the Sisters for their service and witness these last years and to wish them every blessing in the new venture. I wish to express special gratitude to Fr. Pio for his wonderful service as Parish Priest of Gosport. Whilst all of you will be sorry to hear the news, I know too that you will be happy for both the Friars and the Sisters that henceforth they will be able to live in buildings large enough for their communities to be together.
